Other Opportunities

Alongside the weekly activities outlined above, we also offer students opportunities to get involved in different ways. This week, all year groups have had an assembly about the Common Good Leaders Programme that we run, inspired by the Together for the Common Good charity. This is an organisation whose principles are rooted in Catholic Social Teaching, which aims to bring communities closer together and carry out projects which benefit local people. Last academic year, our students did an incredible job of working with Penny Field Schol, Brandon House and local ecology projects. We hope to involve even more students this time around and would like to extend our reach even further.

At the end of September, Year 9 students will have an assembly about the Duke of Edinburgh scheme, in which they will work on volunteering, physical activity and take part in an expedition in June, and Year 10 students will be given the opportunity to apply to be Reading Leaders, where they will work with Year 7 students to build confidence when reading.

Super-curricular Activities

We also offer students the opportunity to complete activities that are linked to their subjects but outside their normal curricula in order to prepare for college and beyond. From year 7 onwards, students can work towards their Faith in Action Award in the RE field. In years 10 and 11 students can work towards an additional GCSE in Further Maths and take part in the Preparing for Excellence Scheme which looks at how to get the most out of your subjects in order to apply to prestigious universities.

Residential Trips

Each of our trips is organised by a specialist trip leader who will correspond with you throughout the organisation process and will run a pre-trip briefing where you can ask any specific questions that you have.

This year, year 10s will have the opportunity to join in the Diocesan Pilgrimage to Lourdes in July. We take a large number of students each year and they always find the experience incredibly profound. Mr Tunnecliff will be launching the pilgrimage in October. Year 9/10s are able to go on the Geography Iceland trip which was launched last year. This trip looks at the incredible geographical features in Iceland. Year 9s can go on the History Battlefields trip to France and Belgium. This is a very emotional trip, on which students visit the battlefields, WW1 museums, war graves and lay a school wreath at the Menin Gate evening ceremony. Year 8s will have the opportunity to go on the Computing London trip which includes a visit to the Harry Potter Studios and the year 7 residential will son be launched, which involves outward bound and teambuilding activities.
